

Aboriginal Family Violence Program

This program provides no fee for service counselling for adults and youth who have experienced family violence. Counselling is one-on-one and may be obtained by personal request or agency referral. Presentations on family violence and referrals to other needed agencies are available upon request. This program provides individuals and families with safety planning and appropriate cultural programming offering sage, sweet grass, awareness and healing circles using aboriginal knowledge.

Elton Davidge Scholarship Fund

The scholarship fund was established through a legacy left by Elton Davidge, long time Executive Director of SIGN.

Life Skills Program

This program is for youth 14-19 that helps develop the skills for everyday living. It gives an individualized program to help develop foundation and abilities.

SIGN Early Learning Centre

A licensed childcare and early learning facility for toddlers and preschool children. The Centre provides access to early childhood education for children and families in the Yorkton area. The Centre offers children high quality childcare, nutrition, and education in the most crucial stage of development.

Triple P Positive Parenting Program

Triple P works by giving parents the skills to raise confident, healthy children and teenagers, and to build stronger family relationships. This program helps to manage behaviours in children and teenagers and to prevent the behaviours from occurring in the future. Triple P gives parents simple and practical strategies they can adapt in a way that suits their own values, beliefs and family/ individual needs. This program offers increasing levels of support to meet the parents needs through individual sessions, group sessions and seminars.

SIGN has operated in Yorkton since 1969. Funding for SIGN's programs comes from a variety of sources, including various levels of government, service clubs, United Way, donations and fees generated for some services.

SIGN PROGRAMS INCLUDE:

SIGN Counselling

SIGN provides counselling on a fee-for-service basis and through Employee and Family Assistance Programs. Services include individual, marital and family counselling.

Sexual Assault Counselling

SIGN provides a special counselling program for men, women and children who have been victims of sexual abuse. A community educator is available for presentations upon request.

Trustee Services

Our trustee provides financial management services to clients designated by the Ministry of Social Services and Mental Health. Private client services are also available. Additional services include but are not limited to: assistance with relocation, income tax preparation, form and application completion, referrals and advocacy as required.

Senior Mobility Program

This program provides low cost transportation for Yorkton seniors.

Vocational Employment Program

This program provides vocational on-site training and supervision to those individuals experi-

Family Support Program

This program provides an in-home support service to families who are referred by MSS or Child and Youth—Mental Health, as well as self referrals. The Family Support Worker works with the family in one or more of the following areas: Parenting, Personal Wellness, Daily Living, Social Resources, and Community Resources. The program serves the Sunrise Health Region.

Adolescent Group Home

SIGN operates a co-ed Group Home licensed for six adolescents. The home provides a residential group care program to assist the child to understand and resolve personal and/or family issues, to prepare the child to return successfully to the care of his/her parent(s), guardian(s), or to provide ongoing care, support and direction leading to independent living as provided under the Family Service Act.

Independent Living Program

This program provides support and assistance to clients with persistent mental illness. Main focus is basic living skills to facilitate independent living.

Acquired Brain Injury

This program addresses the complex needs of people living with Acquired Brain Injury by assisting and encouraging daily living skills, communication skills, social skills, and increased involvement in the community. These skills combine to improve their level of

Employee Assistance Plan and Fee-for-Service Counselling

SIGN has contracts with a number of companies to provide counselling to their employees and families. The counselling is provided by several Registered Social Workers. Fee-for-service counselling is available for individuals, couples and families.

M.C. Knoll Before/After School Program

This program is open on school days and is available to children who attend M.C. Knoll and St. Michael's schools. A monthly calendar of events and activities is designed to promote confidence, responsibility and fun, while enhancing existing skills and abilities.

Yorkdale Before/After School Program

This program allows parents to have a safe, fun place for their children to be before and after school on all school days. Snacks, planned activities and free play time are provided every day. The children take part in crafts, games, gym time, computer time and have the opportunity to make new friends.

Parent Mentoring Program

The mission of this program is to support and strengthen families by providing encouragement and information to expectant parents and parents with young children. This is accomplished through mentoring relationships and activities within the community.
